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## Karl Marx and the concept of crisis

More than twenty years after the collapse of communism, Marx's thought has regained its philosophical dimension. Thanks also to the contribution of non-Marxist authors (this is perhaps the big news), we are now witnessing a revival of studies aimed at highlighting aspects of Marxian thought that seemed to have been consigned to oblivion. The specters of Marx, of which Derrida spoke, are ambiguous and disturbing.


The focus of this conference falls on the overwhelmingly actual aspects of Marx's analyses. The concept of "crisis" has a fundamental role in Marx's thought. It relates to an economic crisis of overproduction that cyclically leads to the blockage of the markets. Yet, crisis in Marx is always at the same time a crisis of values regarding the quality of life and the model of development. It is therefore not a coincidence that, while in the "post-colonial" countries some philosophers have already started rethinking Marx (also through a re-reading of Gramsci), this is now happening also in the industrial, or post-industrial, countries as they are hit by the economic crisis.

The aim of the conference is to bring forth a new vitality in the interpretation of aspects of Marx's thought that connect with the notion of crisis. We do not want to dwell on philological approaches to Marx's texts nor on old issues, but rather to grasp those philosophical and conceptual elements in Marx that might help us to move beyond both the current situation and what has already been thought in its regard, in an effort to find theoretical and practical solutions to the contemporary global crisis of capitalism.
